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Judicial Circuit, sitting as Chancellor.

The undersigned as Special Master in Chancery, and appointed by the Court to execute the decree in the above entitled cause at a former term of this Court would respectfully represent to your Honor, that in pursuance of the terms of said decree he did advertise that he would offer for sale the lands therein described, and therein ordered to be sold at public auction at the front door of the Court House in Carlinville Illinois, after giving public notice of said sale by publishing the same for 3 consecutive weeks, in the Carlinville Democrat a weekly newspaper printed and published in Carlinville in said County; and also by posting notices in 3 of the most public places in said County for more than 20 days before the day by said notices appointed for said sale as follows to wit: One on the Sheriff's bulletin board near the post office in the City of Carlinville; one on the County Clerk's bulletin board in the Court House in the City of Carlinville; one on a tree in the public park in the City of Carlinville; all being in the County of Macoupin, and in each of said notices particularly describing the premises to be sold and stating therein that I would sell the same for cash and afterwards to wit On the 22nd day of October A.D. 1875 at the place, and on the terms and in pursuance of said advertisement and said notices, said real estate was exposed for sale when and where the same was struck off and sold to the Complainants, that is, the said Elizabeth Sherman and the said Barrie E.
