and the said John Mc Palmer heretofore appointed by this Court Special
Master and directed to take and report in writing the testimony herein
having filed his report together with testimony to him presented upon
motion of the said Complainants by their said Solicitor this cause is set
down for hearing upon the pleadings and testimony therein this cause coming
on now to be heard and the Court having examined the pleadings and having
duly heard and considered the evidence it is found by the Court that ~~Loring~~
~~W Reynolds~~ late of said County died on the Sixth day of March AD 1870 and es-
tate that on the date of his death he was seized in fee simple of the fol-
lowing described tracts of land situate lying and being in the County of
Macoupin and State of Illinois: to wit: The South West quarter of Section
numbered Twenty five The South East quarter of section numbered
Twenty six The North West quarter of section numbered Thirty six The
North East quarter of section numbered ~~thirty five~~ ^{of Sherman} all in Township num-
bered Eight north of range numbered one west Also the North West quarter

Seven north of range numbered nine West and the South half of the South
East quarter of section numbered eighteen in township numbered eight north
of range eight West of third principal meridian that the said Lorung H
Reynolds left surviving him as his only Heirs at law his son the said William
H Reynolds his daughter Letitia A Merriweather who had intermarried with the
said Frederick O Merriweather who are the Complainants herein and his grandsons
Willis F Stewart and Walter P Stewart and his granddaughter Gertrude P R.
Stewart who are the only Heirs at law of Gertrude P Reynolds who had intermarried
with Malcolm Stewart and had died prior to the said Lorung H Reynolds all
of whom are minors ~~and~~ are non residents of the State of Illinois the same
being the defendants in this suit that the said Lorung H Reynolds left no
widow surviving him and no other Heirs those above named and that
no other person or persons are in any wise interested in said lands other

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partition of the said premises hereinbefore described be made among the said parties according to their respective interests therein as herein before and that John Fisher Jonathan R Miles and Martin Olmstead who it appears to the Satisfaction of the Court are not connected with any of the parties to this proceeding either by consanguinity or affinity be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners each of whom shall take an Oath by some Justice of the peace of said County fairly and impartially to partition of said lands according to the Judgment of the Court as to the said interests of the said several parties as herein set forth if the same can be done consistently with the interests of the Estate and for this purpose said Commissioners shall go upon the said several tracts of land and make partition of said lands as hereinbefore directed and that they report of their doings under their hands and seals to this Court without unnecessary delay at the present or next succeeding Term Thereupon
